Glen Cove City School District - Board of Education - Brief of Meeting Meeting Date: March 9, 2009

Presentation to the Board:

Dr. Laurence Aronstein presented an overview of the second draft of the preliminary budget for the 2009/2010 school year. This draft, similar to the previous draft presented at the February 23rd meeting of the Board, assumes a decrease in State aide of approximately 16 percent from the level provided for the current school year. In addition, this second draft of the preliminary budget proposes a 1.78 percent increase in a year-to-year, budget-to-budget comparison. Because of the proposed reduction in state aide, this preliminary budget also results in a 5.19 percent increase in the tax levy.

It is anticipated that the recently enacted federal legislation, *The Economic Reinvestment and Recovery Act*, will provide the State with additional funds for education within the next 45 to 60 days. In the meantime the State Legislature will meet this week to discuss the State's budget for next year, with the expectation that the State budget will be finalized by April 1. It is hoped that the restoration of most of the proposed cuts in State aide will preclude the cutbacks currently under consideration in the District's proposed budget. Dr. Aronstein noted that the District budget vote will occur on Tuesday, May 19th, and he addressed questions from Board members and members of the audience regarding the presentation.

Superintendent's Report:

Dr. Aronstein reported:

- Approximately 50 percent of the High School roof will be repaired for \$1M under a contract with an approved roofing contractor.
- The District will enter into a contract next week with an independent engineering/architectural firm to inspect the condition of, and to provide recommendations for the remaining portion of the roof at the High School, the roofs at Deasy and Gribbin Schools, and the boilers at Gribbin School and at Thayer House.
 - The report from this engineering /architectural firm will be used to estimate costs for repairs or replacements to the aforementioned roofs and boilers. It is anticipated that these costs will be funded through a proposed bond issue.
- The State has decided that those students, who were precluded from taking the first part of the English Regents examination due to a snow day, will have the option of taking either the second part only, or taking both parts of the examination.
- There will be a ribbon-cutting ceremony at 10:30 am on Thursday, March 12th, to commemorate a newly established internet radio station, located adjacent to the High School library. It is anticipated that those in attendance at this ceremony will include the honorable, Ralph Suozzi, Mayor of Glen Cove, Diane Yatauro, Nassau County Legislator, a representative from the Governors office and various radio and television sports personalities.
- The Adult Education program has been well received and is in its third week with ten course
 offerings and with the participation of 247 members of the community. This recently
 reenacted program has met and exceeded expectation. :
