#### **SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT:**

**Dr. Aronstein** reported the following information that indicates the beginning of changes that are occurring in the High School and Middle School buildings.

- There were no suspensions in the High School, last week
- There have been no suspensions in the Middle School for the past three-to-four weeks
- Attendance at the High School has been at a 96% daily level during the past month and a half
- High School cuts were at lower level (40%) last month, than they have been for some time.
